


Commencement

Raymond D. Zinser, Ph. D., Professor of Sociology at Graceland College, and special lecturer for Drake University gave the Commencement address for the Class of 1971 at the Rembrandt school Monday evening. His address, "Imagination, Creativity and Reality," pointed up some of the "facts in the development of American culture and warned the need of its continued development, not its destruction. He most emphatically stressed that the class slogan. "We've Only Just Begun" would be found to be of greater truth than any of the class realized.

At the close of his talk, the auditorium was filled with applause until he stood and took a bow. Rev. Robert Hawley gave the invocation. The Salutatory Address, James Haraldson; Girls Sextet sang "Climb the Highest Mountain;" Valedictory Address, Jon Johnson; Supt. Frank Truesdell introduced the speaker, Dr. Zinser.
